Where can I find online practice for the GED?

- Free sample tests are available at GED.com.
- USA Hello offers <u>free online GED classes</u> in 14 languages.

Please note: While you can practice online, New York State *does not offer* online GED testing.





What are New York State's testing policies?

- To receive a New York State GED, you must successfully complete the GED test in New York State.
- To take the New York State GED, you must have been a resident of New York State for at least 30 days.
- Generally, you must be 19 years old to take the GED test in New York State.
 - Certain exceptions apply; <u>learn more about eligibility if you are underage</u>)
- It is free to take the GED test in New York State.
- There is no online GED test option in New York State; you must take the test at a testing center.





GED in other languages

The GED is offered in both Spanish and English.

If you choose to take the Spanish GED, you will get a Spanish GED diploma. This may change your options for post-secondary opportunities.

Alternatively, if you take the science, social studies and math portions of the GED in Spanish but the language arts portion in English, you will receive a general New York State GED.

Updating your GED

The New York State Education Department supports students in updating their GED.

For a Replacement GED

(Allow 4 - 6 weeks)

- Direct online link: <u>Duplicate Diplomas and/or Transcripts | Adult Career and Continuing Education Services | NYS Education Department</u>
- Direct link to form: <u>HSE Duplicate Request</u>
 <u>Form (nysed.gov)</u>
- By telephone: Contact the NYS Education Department at 518-474-3852 and press 2.
 Press 1 for English or 2 for Spanish. Finally, press 7 to speak to an operator.
 - Hours: Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, 10 a.m. – 12 p.m.

Updating your GED

For a Name Change

(Allow 1 - 2 weeks)

What you'll need

- Copy of valid ID (driver's license or learner's permit)
- Copy of the incorrect diploma with the error clearly circled/highlighted/indicated
- A legible request in writing indicating the change ("My name is Jon Smith. On the GED you can see it was spelled John Smith. Please use my driver's license to prove the exact spelling.")
- The HSE Department will not follow up with a notification of a completed change. Requestors are encouraged to follow up after two weeks to see if the changes have been made. Call 518–474–3852 and press 2; then press 1 (English) or 2 (Spanish) and press 7 to speak to an operator.
- Follow the steps on the previous page to request an updated diploma.
